

Struck-By Hazards

THE HAZARD

Vehicles, equipment, falling objects and swinging loads. This is about the space between a worker and something moving, and who is keeping it.

WHAT GOES WRONG

- Walking behind equipment that is backing up, assuming the operator can see you.
- Standing or passing under a suspended load while it is being landed.
- Tools, offcuts and fasteners left loose on a scaffold or an elevated deck.
- High-visibility clothing left in the truck because the job was only going to take a minute.

CONTROLS: BEFORE YOU START

- Wear high-visibility clothing any time equipment or traffic is moving on site.
- Make eye contact with the operator before you enter their swing radius or blind spot.
- Use a spotter for backing and for any lift where the operator loses sight of the load.
- Never stand or walk under a suspended load, and keep clear while it is landed.
- Secure tools and materials at height, and use toe boards so nothing can be kicked off an edge.

ASK THE CREW

1. Who is working below anyone else on this site today?
2. What equipment is moving on this job, and where are its blind spots?
3. How do you get an operator's attention before walking behind their machine?
4. What is stored at height right now that could be knocked off?
